

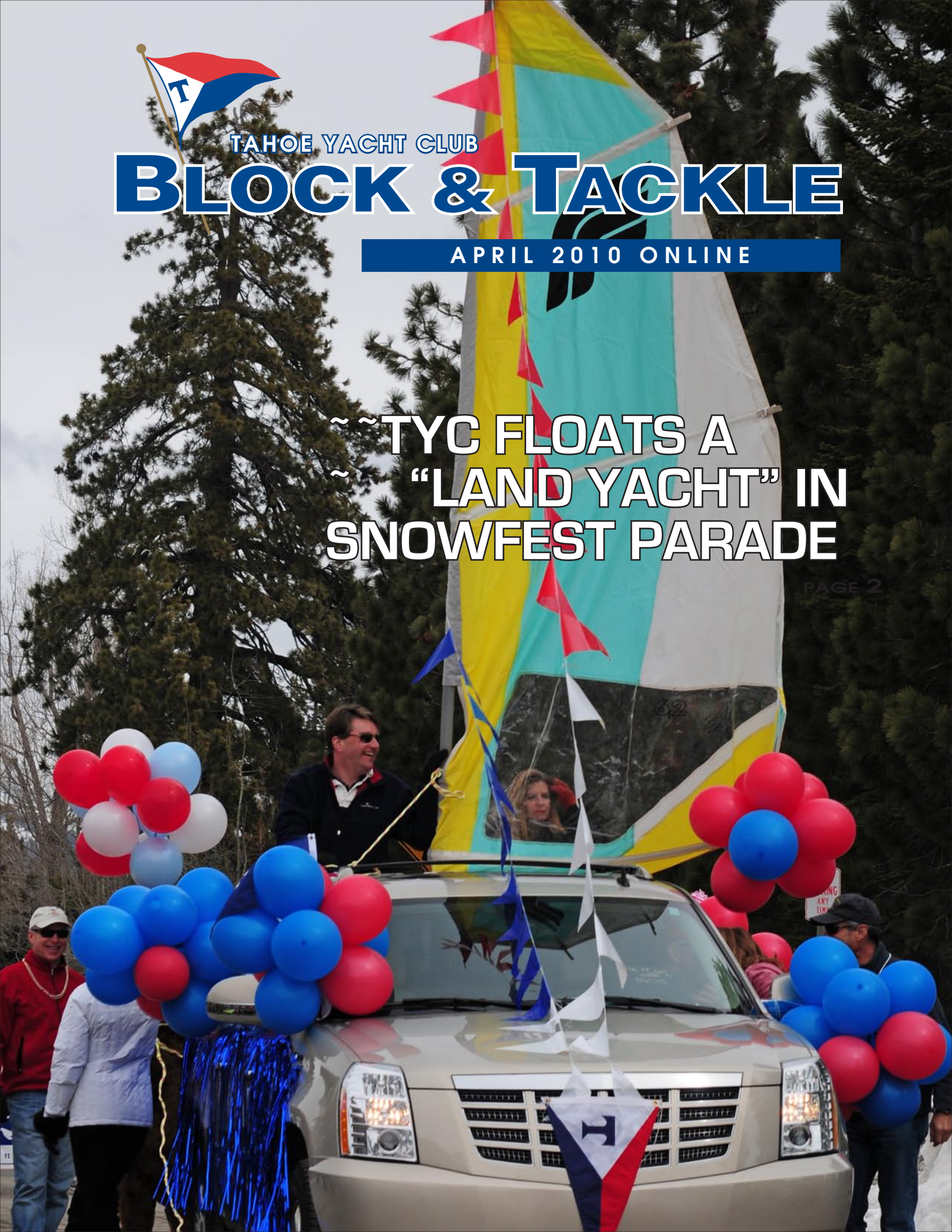

### On the business side...I am pleased to report on several significant developments.

The Facilities Committee reached an agreement with our current landlord, Tahoe Yacht Harbor, extending our leasehold through December 31, 2010, at a competitive market rate. This was the fourth addendum to the lease and provides for a planning period during which we will work together with the landlord to develop a viable plan for remodeling the building, including TYC's clubhouse facility, to its highest and best use. In planning TYC's space, we are forming an Architectural Committee composed of TYC members experienced in architecture, construction and design to work with the landlord. I am grateful to **Barry Ludwig** and **Staff Commodore Paul Cunha** who have agreed to serve in this critical function for our club. Some of the key considerations for the committee will be developing a more efficient layout that better meets the club's current needs, removal of the fireplace to create a more open floorplan, and the extension or installation of a larger waterfront deck. I want to thank the Facilities Committee volunteers **Hal Robinson, Larry Tomlinson** and **Staff Commodore Michael Rosenauer** for their dedicated efforts on behalf of the club.

**Mariana Dye** joined TYC as general manager near the end of the month. She brings a diverse background and relevant business skills to the position including food & beverage management, accounting, budgetary, customer service and scheduling experience. I want to thank the Search Committee volunteers **Diane Shore, Staff Commodore Stacy Conner** and **Walter Nelson** for their diligent efforts in evaluating TYC's needs and the skills necessary to succeed in the general manager position, seeking potential applicants, identifying the strongest candidates and making the final recommendation of Mariana to the Board of Directors. I also want to thank **John Heyne** for his hard work in managing the club during the interim period and on-going commitment to TYC. I look forward to a successful future with Mariana and John at the helm. Please join me in welcoming Mariana to TYC.

With our staffing needs secured, **Rear Commodore Bruce Block** has taken over the duties of the House Committee. At my request, he is forming a group of talented member volunteers with skills in each of the club's operating areas – bar operations, retail/boatique, facilities management and staffing/HR – to serve the club needs well into the future. Please speak with Bruce if you are interested in participating in these critical operations of the club.

At the March Board of Directors meeting, **Treasurer Hal Robison** presented a revised budget that projects a break-even year for TYC based on strict expense controls and incremental revenue expansion from very reasonable expectations for new member growth. **Director Owen Korsmo**, TYC's new Membership Committee chair, is planning a major membership drive in conjunction with our 85th anniversary celebration which is described in this issue of the BLOCK & TACKLE. My personal objective is to significantly beat the membership growth forecast in the

### Peter Graves 1926 ~ 2010

We are saddened by the passing of Peter Graves of a heart attack at his Pacific Palisades home on March 14, just four days shy of his 84th birthday.

Best known for his portrayal of Agent Jim Phelps in the long-running television series "Mission: Impossible," Graves career included nearly three dozen films, and numerous TV shows, most recently as host of PBS's "Discover: The World of Science" and A&E's "Biography" series.

He and his wife, Joan Endress Graves, have been members of Tahoe Yacht Club since 1980, often attending with Joan's sister, Jean, her husband, Staff Commodore/Dr. Frank Roberts and family. Graves spent a lot of time with his family at their Northshore condo where he was often able to do voice-over work from the Lake, according to nephew Eric Roberts. The Minnesota native was also a good water skier, Roberts reports. "He loved to go boating and to snow ski as well, usually at Alpine Meadows."

In addition to Joan, his wife of nearly 60 years, he is survived by the couples' three daughters — Kelly Jean, Caudia King and Amanda Lee — and six grandchildren.

## March 27: Construction/dredging underway at Tahoe City Marina

Construction on the Tahoe City Marina expansion project has been taking place all winter long. For the past several months cranes, barges, and manpower have been hard at work constructing the far west pier, floating docks, and water-breaks that will soon be part of the new Tahoe City Marina directly in front of our clubhouse.

After all the pilings were in place, wood struts were attached to hold in the thousands of boulders that will act as the water-break for the west-side pier of the marina. In addition, dredging has begun on the shore-side of the marina, and floating docks are being constructed to accommodate 30 new boats this summer. Eventually, a total of 80 slips will be produced when all is finished.

The wave attenuators that you see furthest out in the picture above are temporary until the construction has completed and ultimately, a permanent pier will stretch further out diagonally to create a wider opening for boaters.

## Interview with Mariana Dye, new TYC General Manager

Not really knowing where I was going, other than a city in California, I ended up working for Home-wood Mountain Resort in December 2000. It was then that I first fell in love with Tahoe.

After the winter season was over, I was still not ready to go back home and decided to

First and foremost, the nature surrounding the area is beyond beautiful. I love to be outdoors and practice different types of sports. I enjoy spending time with my children outside on the bike

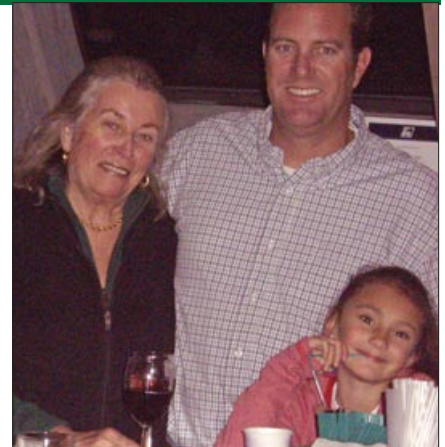

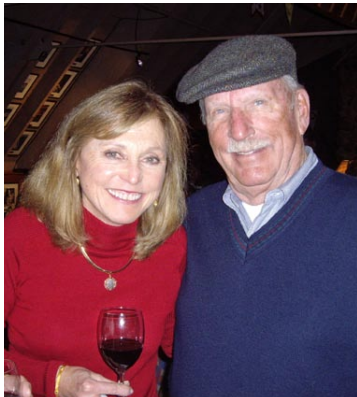
### What attracted you to join Tahoe Yacht Club as general manager?

We have one event left in our official schedule – April 16 at Squaw Valley USA with our after-skiing barbecue. Details to be announced.

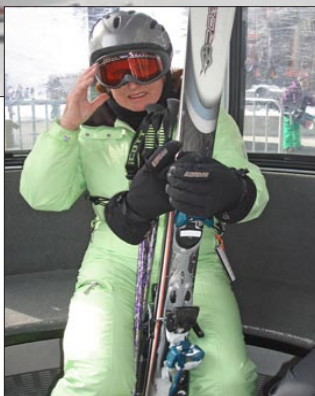

## Midwinters wrap up with TYC podium finishes

### Golden Gate Yacht Club's Midwinters

The annual midwinter mayhem wrapped up in March with TYC again acquitting itself well. Chinook also had the fastest elapsed and corrected times of all the boats racing in the other two divisions and was the fastest boat in the entire regatta. "It was one of those races where we had great

wind and sailed very fast. A great way to end a fun winter series. We will now sail in the J-Fest regatta in April, the Farallon Race, and the Vallejo Race before returning to Tahoe in late May," Duffy reports.

### And more racing...

Denise Hammond and Phil Kanegsberg managed a second in Richmond Yacht Club's "Big Daddy" Ultimate 20 fleet on March 13 and a fabulous 66(?) in the Sunday pursuit race. "We did pretty well for the first half of the island race before we got caught in the lee of Angel Island," Kanegsberg reports. The next race for EUPHORIC will be the Konocti Cup on Clear Lake at the end of April.

The fleet is looking forward to the offshore portion of the season starting with the crewed lightship. Taking place on March 20, it was a very modest trip out and back with the WICKED group clearing the Golden Gate and finishing just after 1 p.m. in the afternoon in second place. Coming up is the crewed Farallons, the Spinnaker Cup to Monterrey on the offshore side and the ubiquitous Great Vallejo Race in early May for those who choose not to venture out the Gate and instead drink beer in the sunshine. 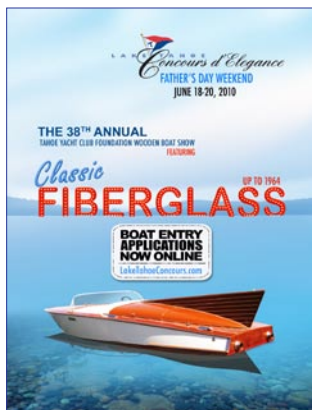
## Boat exhibitor application deadline extended to April 30 for 38th annual Lake Tahoe Concours
