To reach the Penguin's meeting spot at Paige Meadows from Hwy. 89: Turn off on Pine St. (just north of Sunnyside). The group will meet in the parking area at 11 a.m., then make the six- to seven-minute walk into the Meadows.

Each September, Pacific Inter-Club Yacht Association member clubs complete a tally to see how they stack up for the "Club of the Year" award. For the past two years we have filed our report and this year have again qualified as a "One Star Club" (up to 100 points in the scoring system). In 2002 our total was 75, and this year, 83.

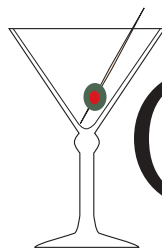
